JUST A STONE'S THROW FROM THE AVENUE DES CHAMPS-ÉLYSÉES, Hotel Raphael Paris (www.raphael-hotel.com) is located in a peaceful haven on the main route to the Eiffel Tower. The property blends traditional modernity with sumptuous welcoming simplicity, attracting an array of established and discerning guests with 52 rooms and 38 suites to choose from, as well as a gourmet restaurant, six conference and banqueting rooms, Bar Anglais, a fitness room, a business corner, and concierge services.

The Raphael Suite is comprised of two sets of rooms that can be let independently: The first, the Penthouse Suite, boasts a spacious bedroom, magnificently decorated with Chinese-inspired 18th century paneling and Louis XVI-style furnishings; a communicating door between the bedroom and a private sitting room; and an oak staircase leading to a small office and then to an enclosure that opens out onto a panoramic terrace. The last three artisan potters working in earthenware in Paris created the unique decor for the

Situated on the sixth floor, the Arc de Triomphe Suite consists of a bedroom, a sitting room with a desk and sofas, and immaculate furnishings, as well as a fully equipped mini-bar, king-size bed, and work table in the bedroom. The marble bathroom boasts natural daylight and a separate shower, and the suite is surrounded by a magnificent terrace, which offers a breathtaking view over the Arc de Triomphe.

Also famed for its unique view, the Eiffel Tower Suite consists of a bedroom with a communicating door to a sitting room, a superb bathroom decorated with ceramics, and traditional Louis XV and Louis XVI-style furniture includ-



ing red velvet-covered sofas and chairs, writing desk, chests of drawers, and a pedestal table. A magnificent terrace runs along the length of the suite, offering a unique view of the most famous monument in Paris.

three bathrooms, inspired by the decorative themes of the rooms. Each has a bath and separate shower, and one boasts its own balneotherapy system.

The second, the Duplex Suite, is comprised of a bedroom with a

magnificent bronze staircase leading to an office enclosure and terrace. The bathroom, with its Provencal-style ceramics and separate shower, brings a pleasant touch of warmth.

The Presidential Suite provides a sitting room with communicating doors to two bedrooms, which includes double or twin beds; traditional Louis XV, Louis XVI, and Directoire-style furniture, which

includes a day-bed, sofa, velvet-covered chairs, and writing desk; a large dressing room; and three bathrooms with separate shower, one with a pretty boudoir and a dressing table.
