A LUXURY COLLECTION HOTEL, THE CHATWAL NEW YORK (THECHATWALNY.COM), is elegantly situated in the heart of Manhattan's buzzing theater district, and recreates the iconic glamour and style of 1930s Gotham. The landmark Stanford White building opened in 1905 as the home of the famous Lambs, America's first professional theater club. Meticulously restored and modernized by Thierry Despont, the property is the first Starwood Luxury Collection hotel in Manhattan, as well as the first in the Virtuoso Preview program portfolio. The 76 guest rooms and suites draw inspiration from glamorous, early 20th-century travel. A range of indulgent amenities on-site include the 2,400-square-foot Elizabeth Arden Red Door Spa boasting three expertly appointed treatment rooms, three private changing suites with steam showers, and a manicure and pedicure studio; flexible spaces for



neure studio; flexible spaces for meetings and private events for up to 120 people featuring ultramodern technology throughout; and The Lambs Club, a generous 90-seat restaurant where diners can revel in the culinary genius of Chef Geoffrey Zakarian.

The Chatwal's 4,500-squarefoot Barrymore Suite is named for actress Drew Barrymore's

well-known grandfather. The suite consists of The Director Suite and The Producer Suite, which can be booked individually or combined as The Barrymore Suite. Guests can enjoy exclusive use of the 10th floor, including four spacious guest rooms, four full bathrooms, and two sitting rooms, dining rooms, and kitchenettes. Guests may also enjoy a private, heated outdoor terrace and a 1,000-square-foot roof deck overlooking 44th Street.

The Stanford White Studio named for the famous architect, originally served as the Club's library. The entire room has been meticulously refurbished and reinstalled, complete with the original oak-paneled walls and beams, a working granite fireplace with a richly detailed wood mantle, and a fully furnished private outdoor terrace.
